














Electronic Journals

What are electronic journals?	They are journals that have some form of electronic access. This does not mean that full-text is automatically available. Some journals only have Table of Contents electronically.
What formats do e-journals come in?	PDF – requires Adobe Acrobat. HTML – HTML can change the layout of an article, it usually is more pages than the original citation and there may or may not be graphics.
Can I access e-journals from home?	Yes, but most e-journals have a restricted license, so you will need to be using Gatorlink Dialup , a Proxy Server or VPN at home. Our licenses are for IP-driven access. We do not use IDs and passwords.
What years are available full-text?	That varies depending on the publisher. Some may be from 1997 – present OR only the last 2 years OR some don't allow access to the latest articles and you only have access to earlier years.

Database	Searching Tips
Certain full-text articles are available in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PubMed 	Limit your search to the Subset "PubMed Central" and you will retrieve all free full-text articles. Retrieve even more free full-text by adding: AND free full text [sb] to your search terms. When doing regular searches, be sure you are accessing through the PubMed link from the HSCL database page. When you look at your citations in the "Abstract" or "Citation" display, you will see icons for those we have available full-text: <div style="text-align: center;">  Int J Obes Relat Metab Disord 2003 Jan;27(1):128-33 <div style="display: flex; justify-content: center; gap: 10px;">    </div> </div>
In EBSCOHOST databases some articles are available full-text in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CINAHL • PsychINFO Most articles are available full-text in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Alt HealthWatch • Health Business FullTEXT 	Some citations are directly linked to full text:  Linked Full Text If there is no full text icon, you can click on the  button and another screen opens showing further possibilities for finding full-text options. You <i>can</i> limit your search to only directly linked full text articles by checking the box in the REFINE SEARCH section but it will bypass those articles where there are other full-text options.

ScienceDirect , via Elsevier has full articles for over 1800 journals.	Limit search to full-text,  OR search through full-text journals
